Wordo: The Eye Gaze Version!

What Is Wordo?

Wordo is a wonderful version of 'Bingo' that supports students in working on words. Specifically, high frequency or high utility words (e.g., words from the classroom word wall) are presented on a grid. Students are given print clues (e.g., 'It has 5 letters.') or sound clues (e.g., 'It starts with the /b/ sound.'), and locate the one word that reflects that clue. How to Adapt Wordo for Eye Gaze Users

The first rule is, do NOT make a student who uses AAC use his or her device to play Wordo. That **greatly and inappropriately** increases the difficulty of the activity!

Instead, just use a simple eye gaze frame. You can make a PVC frame or use

this super simple strategy.

1) Get a plastic trade card holder (these are used for baseball cards, Pokemon, etc.)

- 2) Cut out the center square (to look through in order to clearly read eye gaze)
- 3) Cut out Wordo words & put in squares
- 4) Use squares of Fun Foam + tape to place over answers

Ex: Student found word <u>not</u> to rhyme with <u>pot</u> and partner placed red foam over word

Note: For students who are beginning this

Task, or whose eye gaze is challenging to 'read, consider using only four words initially, placed in the four corners
