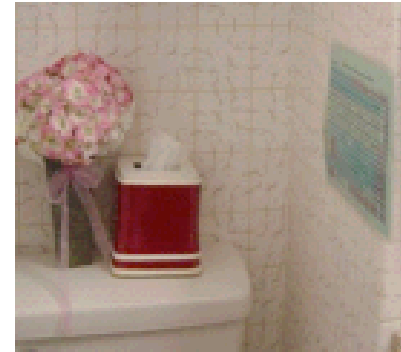
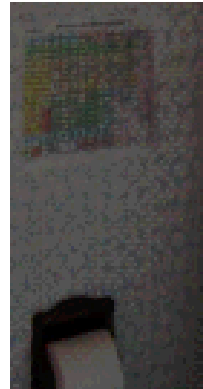


Talking . . . EVERYWHERE!

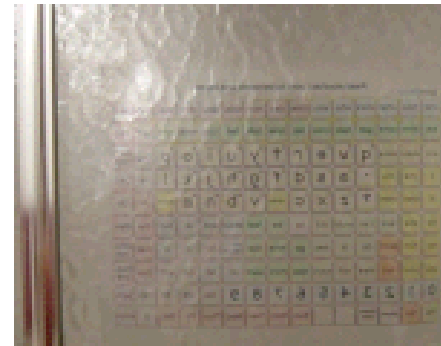


Who is This For?

This activity is for anyone who uses AAC! High tech devices are just great, but are not very useful in places such as . . . well . . . the shower! Sticky displays can be affixed throughout the bathroom, where high tech devices just aren't likely to be used!

Where Could We Put Displays?

As shown on the following pages, stickyback displays can be affixed to the shower, bathroom walls, etc., while magnetic-backed displays can be mounted on the refrigerator. Think outside the box, and you'll come up with many locations for light-tech backup or activity-specific displays!



How Do I Prepare These Displays??

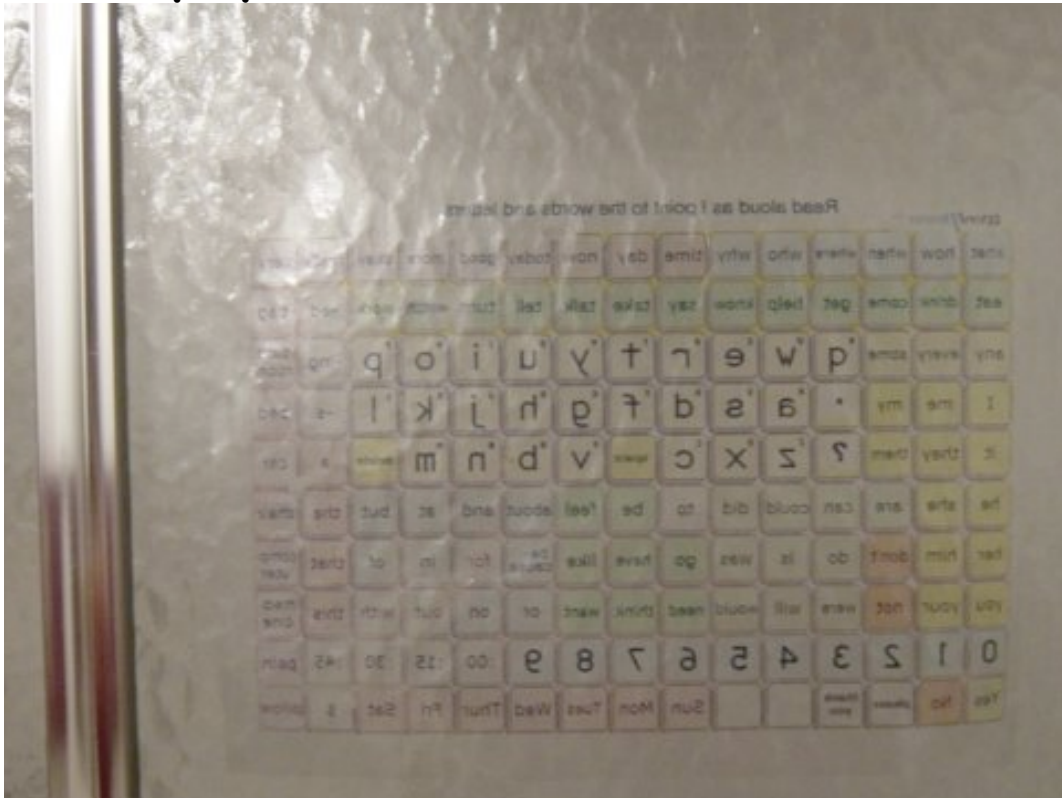
Directions:

- 1) Decide what communication display you want to reproduce
 - a) Main board for high tech device (as shown above)
 - b) Activity-based display (e.g., specific conversation about taking a shower). This should be personalized. For example, Josh is a teen, so 'Get out of here' is on target!
- 2) Create the communication display on your computer, or scan it in
- 3) Print the display onto:
 - a) Avery 3276 Ink Jet Decals for Windows. These are stickyback decals that adhere to windows or mirrors. They can be removed without leaving a sticky residue.
 - b) Avery printable magnetic paper. This can be used to print displays to place on surfaces such as the refrigerator.
