

# **ASSEMBLING THE SONGBOARDS**

**CREDIT:** First, we want to give credit for the concept of making and using songboards to Carol Goossens'. She has worked with UCP of NYC and the Department of Education, NYC to develop scores of incredible songboards that are used with children who are AAC users throughout New York. We have used her model to develop these songboards. Any errors, of course, belong to us!

#### A NOTE ABOUT SIZE:

These files are made to fit on a page (layout, scene, etc.) Printing them in the original will make 'file folder displays' which are fine for very small groups (1-3), such as speech therapy sessions (Note: Use a legal sized file folder & turn it sideways). For larger groups, you will want to enlarge these displays. Here are some ideas.

- for songboards that are 15" wide, use 160%
- for songboards that are 22" by 22", use 250%

Play around with %s to find the one that works best for you!

### HOW TO ENLARGE DISPLAYS:


Enlarging is not easy to do in Adobe Acrobat! Here are some ideas to help you enlarge:

#### For Macs


Plan A: Use the original software (BoardMaker or SuperPaint). You can adjust printing size as you print. (Do this from Page Setup - reduce or enlarge).

Plan B: Within Acrobat, copy the picture (use the graphics tool if your version of Acrobat includes it. Otherwise, take a 'screen shot' of the page, and paste it into a paint program. Then use the page setup to enlarge it at the desired percent.

For PCs Go to view-fit page Go to Tools (on menu bar)-select graphics You will get crosshairs. Select the whole image. Edit-copy Paste into any paint program Page setup-scale-150%








### PROPS: SEE BABY SIT SONG


Attach door to door on scene - hinge on right with tape, so it can open to hide baby behind



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"See baby sit, on the table. See baby sit, on the floor, See baby sit, on the chair, See baby sit, behind the door.



# **Communication**

Slot-Filler: Three slots to fill:

- *locations:* chair / floor / door
- actions: sit / stand / jump
- prepositions: on / under / behind
